AUSTRALIAN GLIDER MUSEUM - SUNDAY 22ND JANUARY 2023

Something different from our normal Clubs Sunday Coffee Run, a visit to Australian Gliding Museum located at Bacchus Marsh Airport.

On arrival at Airport, we were welcomed by every fly living within 20 kilometres radius of the airport or so it seemed. As this was not far from home members found their own way and by arriving at their own leisure made a steady stream of Club Cars giving the many Glider Students and Pilots something other than planes to admire and ask questions about. As you see in the images a very good turnout of various makes and models of Club Cars presented a good picture in front of the Museum.

We were soon shepherded into Glider Museum where morning tea and coffee with Cakes awaited us. Museum provided plenty of tables and chairs, so no one missed out on a seat or morning tea.

After a suitable time, David Goldsmith curator and pilot of many different types of planes and gliders gave the members a fantastic presentation of the history of Gliding.

David's knowledge of most things that fly had members enthralled so much so that many had questions of David and not once was he stumped.

David told the members about some harrowing flights he did and as he was still with us lived to tell us those stories. David met his wife also a Glider Pilot and even today remains a Glider Pilot Instructor, she was unable to join us as she was conducting pilot training.

David did ask if any member might be interested in taking a flight, we have a few members saying they would return and avail themselves of the opportunity for a fly, once they check their insurance is all paid up.

The actual displays although placed close together, David mentioned we were not to touch the gliders as their wing material is paper thin and easily punctured.

In other buildings David explained about what was happening with restorations that were under way, some of the Gliders will never fly again as they are far too fragile.

In one corner of the Museum stood a lonely vehicle needing a lot of care to get it working again. This vehicle happened to belong to an Old Melbourne Gangster named Squizzy Taylor. The vehicle was modified with large winch with a long wire rope that was used for many years as a tow to get Glider Airborne.

After finishing at Museum and thanking David for his presentation and excellent morning tea we headed off for lunch at Bacchus Marsh Golf Club.

We would thoroughly recommend the Golf Club for a meal. They were so efficient some members placed their lunch orders and by the time they sat down meals were delivered. Many sat around after lunch chatting and commented on having a good day.

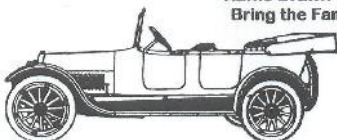

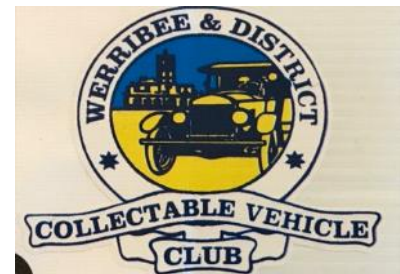

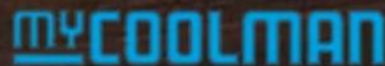
