Snacks and Coffee available all day from **The Mini Express Coffee Food Van** we had onsite, even though we experienced a bit of trouble with power supply earlier in the day.


Thank you to members who volunteered and turned up early to get the setup gazebos etc., and remained behind to dismantle and clean the site.

A few book ideas for the coming cold months

Bit of time since a few book reviews, but there are two new books that have popped up recently and I thought well worth letting some more of you know about them. The first one is a bit more general in topic.

The title is 'Old Vintage Melbourne 1960-1990' put together by Chris Macheras and published by 'Scribe'. This is a new release book and as you might expect is full of magnificent photos from the 60's through to 90's as many will remember that era. Naturally there are many shots of the streets of Melbourne crammed with the huge range of vehicles that occupied the streets at that time. There are also shots of early shopping centres when they first started to sprout. Shots from the Sorrento ferry as it passes an immigrant ship coming into berth. Shots of Westgate bridge under construction. Now if you say to yourself, 'yes, seen all those photos' then I can give you a pretty solid assurance you haven't seen these before. The book is full of so many new photos that a turn of every page will be sure to bring memories of living around Melbourne flooding back. Highly recommended.

The second is also a very new publication but is more 'vehicle specific' and before many raise their eyes thinking. 'Oh my God he's going to bang on about another bloody Holden book' . . . then lower your eyes again and read on, all will be ok.

This book is entitled 'The cars of the 50's' and subtitled 'A history of cars manufactured and assembled in Australia during the 1950's. Its by a chap called Gavin Farmer and published by 'New Holland Publishers'. Now while Gavin Farmers name is new to me, he certainly bursts out of the blocks with this book.

He covers all the manufacturers from the period in intense detail. The author obviously has the best taste in cars as it is GMH he starts with, he follows on with companies like, Chrysler, Austin, BMC, the Rootes group, He also has a chapter on that other little pesky company called Ford (though of course I can't bring myself to read that part).

Then of course there was the 'niche' players like Hartnett, Mercedes, Renault, Goggomobil, Willy's and Land Rover etc


The photos are stunning and the text has you just wanting to read on and on.


