## Club's Weekend Trip to Shepparton 21<sup>st</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> February

### Friday.

Member's tuned up at two locations, these arranged to suit those who lived along the way so no need to back track.

First group met at Hungry Jacks, Manor Lakes for a Barista Coffee and recharge their inner self before heading off on a much anticipated cruise to Shepparton.

At the designated time of around 9:45AM we headed off.

Many members opted for one of their later model club cars that had A/C installed as weather forecast predicted to be hot across all days, we were also able to motor along at around 100Kmh for the whole trip.

Plan for our weekend cruise was to stay off freeways as much as possible so a 2.5 Hr. direct route turned into a 3.5 Hr. cruise through Bacchus Marsh, Trentham and onto Heathcote for leisurely lunch at Gaffney's Bakery on the edge of town.

Lunch location was meeting point for our other members who by time we arrived were already enjoying lunch.

After everyone was ready we headed off once more to drive to Kirwan's Bridge, Mooroopna and onto Shepparton.

About 30 minutes out of Heathcote we stopped to take a walk around the ruins of one of many WW2 internment camps dotted throughout Victoria. This one located in Heathcote-Graytown National park. German prisoners captured after battle between **HSK Kormoran** and **HMAS Sydney** off the coast of Western Australia were transferred via Freemantle and Murchison and were joined by Italian and Finnish internees placed there by government of the day. Prisoners of this Graytown timber cutting camp were required to cut and collect firewood from the area as there was a shortage of firewood around as many local timber cutters had joined up to fight in the war overseas.

After walking around these old ruins, there aren't actually any buildings still standing but concrete and brick foundations are dotted around site.



We then moved off to head to Kirwan's Bridge a further 20 odd minutes up the road.



This is a beautiful Old Timber Bridge that no longer carries vehicular traffic across (Temporarily Closed) Goulburn Weir.

A similar Old timber Bridge (Chinaman's Bridge) crossing same weir is also closed, but a new road bridge is built alongside.

The Club previously visited both these bridges, Kirwan's Bridge we actually drove over on 7<sup>th</sup> February 2020 during another weekend tour to Benalla.

After this stop all were eager as temperature was rising to get to Hotel for well-earned rest, a cold drink or dip in the pool before heading out for dinner at Shepparton Club, only a short walk from Hotel.

Being a Friday the Club held meat tray raffle (60 Trays) and Judy won one a \$50 meat tray voucher that she collected the night before we departed.

A number of members also found an Ice-cream shop on their walk home; this became a nightly pilgrimage after dinner.

## Saturday (Morning)

After breakfast and not too early we headed for a short drive for a tour of Southern Rod and Customs workshops where we met “**Duck**” who explained their setup and gave a tour of all their workshops situated on one block. Member ladies and guys we’re soon drooling with the magnificent show room vehicles on display plus world class workman ship of cars going through various stages of builds. ### 1952 CADILLAC (ANNIVERSARY MODEL)

Alf's story with his Cadillac began about 10 years ago when he went to Geelong to buy a car bonnet with a mate of his and happened to notice an old car sitting in a back yard up for sale worse for wear.

Alf didn't give it much thought, but over the weekend this car haunted him, Alf contacted the owner and after some serious haggling the car changed ownership and was on a trailer heading towards Werribee. After a short period of time, the car was started and huffing puffing smoke, the engine was clapped out removed.

After a few months the rebuilt engine was installed and started up. There was some odd noises coming from the engine, the engine builder was contacted and said (don't worry about it mate she will be right) The car was started up and driven about 10 metres and seized up.

Dejected and disgusted Alf let the car sit untouched for two months.

Eventually he returned to the car and found there was a problem with the gudgeon pin, the engine was removed again, problem solved and engine reinstalled.

The restoration continued with chrome work and many other usual parts replaced and fully restored.

About 4 years ago Alf discussed a partial respray with his mate Mark Reilly and was thinking of just respraying the roof. Alf was advised a full sand down and a total respray would achieve much better results. Many months were occupied in the garage working away.

Alf advises the car hails from Alabama USA and is still motoring along and much enjoyed by Alf, he has no intentions of selling his beloved piece of American motoring history.
