Mum came out and was horrified but was more concerned about how we would get the tire marks off the wall of the building, to remove any evidence of the collision. With buckets of soapy water and scrubbing brushes we achieved the task and no questions were ever asked by our neighbours. After that episode mum took the car off me and gave it to my uncle. I never saw it again.

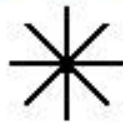
